## Inclusive Europe is an arena for increased mobility and exchange of skills between EU member states.

The vision is to establish a platform for transnational cooperation which will have an impact on the labour market development in the Baltic Sea Region and Europe.

## Together we can make a difference!

Over one hundred million EU citizens are unemployed. According to EU's growth and employment strategy – EU 2020 – a part of the solution is increased mobility and exchange of skills between EU's member states.

Exchange with organisations in other EU member states can contribute to finding effective and innovative solutions for individuals with a weak position on the labour market.

An example of gains by transnational cooperation is Urkraft, a Swedish association working with unemployed youths. After having done training and gained new skills the unemployed youths had problems proving their new qualifications. By looking to the U.K. the solution was found. Together the countries developed the method, called OCN, Open College Network, which validated their skills.

## Would you like to develop cooperation around labour market issues?

*Inclusive Europe* (a Swedish Social Fund project) offers the opportunity to build networks between EU member states in fields such as: social enterprise, training/validation, gender mainstreaming, integration, rehabilitation and prevention of sick leave. During the period 2012–2014 *Inclusive Europe* offer:

- A transnational meeting place at the yearly event *WorkingLife*.
- A web site with inspiration, practical tips and data bases with partners and contact persons.
- Organizing networks and matching organizations in order to develop long lasting cooperation and exchange of skills.
- Training about EU 2020 and the Baltic Sea Strategy.
- Certification/validation of transnational qualifications.
